Benefits

Qualified Haudenosaunee high school students receive financial assistance of 80% to enroll in SU courses offered through Project Advance*.

Eligibility

- Be a high school student with senior standing, or a home-schooled student equivalent to the senior year of high school for online courses.
- Be a certified citizen of one of the Haudenosaunee Nations (Mohawk, Oneida, Onondaga, Cayuga, Seneca, or Tuscarora).
- Reside on one of the Haudenosaunee Nation territories listed below for a minimum of three years prior to and during enrollment in SU courses through Project Advance.
- Apply for the scholarship by the SUPA registration deadline (see registration page for deadlines).
- You do not need to be a citizen of the US or Canada to be eligible for the Promise.

Project Advance is a premier cooperative partnership linking Syracuse University (SU) with secondary schools.

Through this partnership, high schools can offer qualified seniors the opportunity to enroll in SU courses for college credit. Teachers who qualify through SUPA as SU adjunct instructors teach enhanced concurrent enrollment university courses in high schools during the school day.

- Project Advance offers 50 SU courses from a variety of academic disciplines, with new courses added annually.
- More than 12,000 students in more than 200 high schools across six states annually enroll in SU courses through Project Advance.
- More than 878 high school teachers are certified as adjunct SU instructors.
